

Carter resigns as LWV president

Neva Carter of Farmington Hills has resigned as president of the West Bloomfield-Farmington Area League of Women Voters to become administrative aide to State Sen. Doug Ross.

Her decision to start immediately in the Farmington Hills office of the senator's 15th district was announced at the LWV annual meeting last week.

JoAnn Roberts of West Bloomfield was elected to fill the balance of Mrs. Carter's term through next April.

Other officers elected were Anne Dziuba, first vice president; Patsy Smith, second vice president; Jeanne Moriarty, treasurer; and Sue Willis, secretary.

Elected to the board of directors were Ruth Brown, Marcia Himmelhoch, Pat Riley, Susan Rose, Shirley Saham and Lila Schwartz.

The local program for the year was adopted by members for study, support

or action with two revisions.

Farmington area members and West Bloomfield area members will combine work on updating sewage and drainage studies.

WEST BLOOMFIELD members voted to restate their local government. They will examine and compare city, charter township and the present general law township forms of government.

In proposing updating the league's former position for cityhood, Ann Beuerle pointed out there are new state laws giving townships powers previously reserved for cities.

"In a joint meeting with Concerned Citizens for West Bloomfield, there seemed to be little interest in cityhood," said Mrs. Beuerle.

Gordon Lewis, Farmington Hills Library director, spoke to league members on how the age of information is making control of our own lives more difficult.

Warning of the dangers of the computer age and the pitfalls of controls on cable television, Lewis suggested "a lot of information can be a dangerous thing."

"We used to learn from nature. Now children are depending on the media. We are retiring from decision making, thinking we're not informed," said Lewis.

"We know more about Sadat than our own mayors," said Lewis.

Who will control access to cable television and who will finance it were two questions raised but left unanswered by Lewis.
