WHAT IS PLANNED

All interested citizens are advised that the Oakland County Road Commission is proposing a widening of Orchard Lake Road to five (5) lanes from Grand River to I-496 in the Cities of Farmington and Farmington Hills. The proposed improvement includes the construction of five lanes of concrete pavement totaling 69' in width with concrete curbs and improved drainage and signalization.

PROJECT LOCATION

PURPOSE AND FUNDING

The proposed improvement is being done in the public interest to improve safety and traffic capacity. The cost of this work is to be paid from Michigan Transportation Funds and Federal Highway Trust Funds, under the Urban System Program.

Under the provisions of Federal Law, any citizen who may be affected by the proposed project may request, in writing, that the Oakland County Road Commission hold a formal public hearing concerning the social, environmental and economic effects of such an improvement. Such written requests should be mailed to the Oakland County Road Commission on or before May 23, 1980.
