

Seaholm trackmen dominate Southfield

Scott Harper led the Birmingham Seaholm boys' track team to an 85-42 win over Southfield last Thursday. Harper didn't beat the Jays all by himself, but he did chip in 10 points with wins in the mile (4:33.2) and the two-mile (10:09.1).

"I thought Scott Harper had a real nice double for Seaholm," said Southfield coach Tom Eschmann.

Southfield was without the services of senior Vincent Bean. Bean aggravated a pulled hamstring muscle competing against Royal Oak Kimball. The injury may be serious enough to keep him out of track for the rest of the season.

"I don't want to say he's gone,"

said Eschmann, "but it doesn't look good."

The Jays did win Bean's specialty. Freeman Donloe took the long jump with a leap of 18-4. Seaholm took the rest of the field events. Steve Ross was a winner for Seaholm in the discus with 131 feet, and teammate Steve Rose won the shot put 48-8.

Kip Kimble won the high jump (6-0), and Jim Roth won the pole vault (13-0).

Other Seaholm individual winners were Mike Glavin in the 100-yard dash (10.5), Mike Redman in the 440-yard dash (53.0), John Worsley in the 880-yard run (2:09.4), Andy Fremuth in the 550-yard low hurdles (40.8)

and Mike Otero in the 120-yard high hurdles (16.5).

Seaholm coach Jim Roth Sr. blamed his squad's slow times on the poor condition of the Maples' track.

Southfield's Darryl Harris, who was undefeated in the 120-yard high hurdles coming into the meet, false started and was disqualified.

The only Southfield individual winner, other than Donloe, was Mike Wals in the 220-yard dash (24.8).

Southfield did take two relays. Wals, Darrell Jones, Donloe and Reggie Hayes won the 440-yard relay (46.3), and Cornelius Edwards, Mark Harris, Wals and Darryl Darden won the 880-yard relay (1:37.5).

and the 220-yard dash (22.86). He won the long jump (19-4 1/2). And he ran the anchor leg on Lahser's winning 440-yard relay team (45.1).

Eby's time in the 220 tied the Lahser school record.

Other members of the winning 440 relay team were Fred Moeller, Aaron Koonce and Keith Kelgen.

Kevin Munson also helped add a few points to the Lahser total. Munson won the 120-yard high hurdles (16.4) and the 330-yard low hurdles (40.2). He also anchored the winning 880-yard relay team of Kelly Reagan, Koonce and Kelgen. The quartet turned in a 1:33.7 clocking.

Lahser dominated the field events. Moeller won the shot put (43-

4), Mark Place won the discus (113-6), and Tim Wau won the high jump (6-5).

Lahser's Terry Bobbitt won the pole vault (11-0).

Aside from Eby and Munson, the only other Lahser runner to win an individual track event was Doug Lambert (2:04.6).

The team of Wau, Koonce, Bernard Ramke and Steve Zanecki did win the mile relay (3:35.6), giving the Knights a sweep.

Lahser's individual winners were John Middlebrook in the mile (4:30.3) and the two-mile (10:01.6), and Paul Wigoda in the 440-yard dash (53.4).

Lahser is 3-1 overall, 2-0 in the

Metro Suburban Association. The Knights host Royal Oak Dondero on Thursday.

Lahser also hosts the Lahser relays on Saturday. Field events get underway at 10 a.m. with running events scheduled for 1 p.m.
