Energy survey underway

A survey on energy usage of residents of Oakland and Livingston counties is underway by the Oakland Livingston Counties is underway by the Oakland Livingston Human Sayrice Agency and Michigan State Unifersity.

A random sample of 250 residents has been made. Thirty OLHSA staff and volunteers, identifiable by OLHSA employee badges, are conducting the hour-long interviews.
