THE PATROLS have been assigned to three areas of Pontiac during the past two weekends. The assignments are based on research which showed areas during 1978 which had the most alcohol-related accidents.

Among the targeted areas are sec-tions of Woodward south of Pontiac and portions of Telegraph in south Oak-land County.

There are "no definite plans" for moving the squads into those areas, said Jerry Fedderson, director of the project. It's a question of when rather than whether, he added.

The Michigan Licensed Beverage Association (MLBA) has endorsed the al-cohol enforcement program. Its deci-

sion has turned out to be controversial from all the aggravation this has

among its members.
