Michigan law requires all companies engaged in the remodeling business to have a Builders License or Home Improvement Contractors License. All salesman, sales designers or sales estimators entering a private home must also be licensed by the state to the company which employs them, which is anyone soliciting business in your home.

The company license is to be displayed, along with a sales tax or resale license, in an office or showroom for the public to see

The home owner should ask to see the license and check the individuals name, the company that is licensed and if the card has expired. An old card may indicate that he has been turned down for renewal.
