Ms. Hauser is a member of the Council of Foreign Relations and is vice chairwoman of the board of trustees of the Institute on International Education. She has been a member of the Commission on U.S.-Latin American Relations.

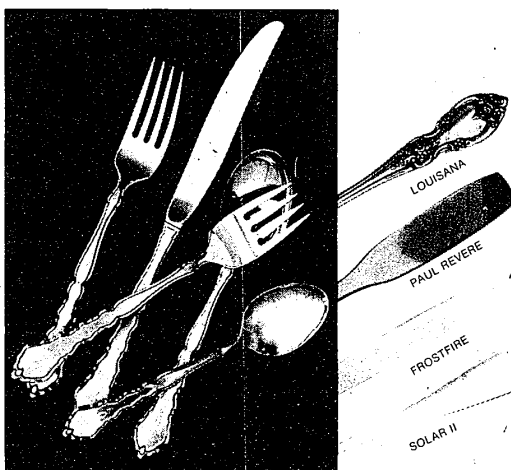

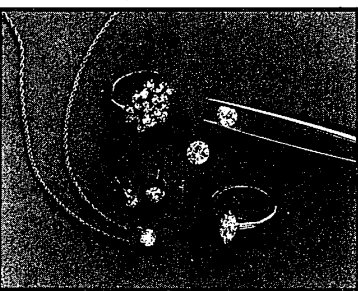
