## Marijuana research program to begin

The Comprehensive Cancer Center of Metropolitan Detroit will be studying the use of marijuana by cancer patients, approved by the state legislature last year.

In addition, researchers at the Cancer Center are involved in studies of marijuana derivatives in the animal model.

"We are encouraged by the mounting scientific evidence coming out of studies of purified marijuana derivatives," said Dr. John Ingall, the Comprehensive Cancer Center's association director for cancer control.

"There is some indication that smoking the crude plant can be justified. We face the dilemma, however, that the risks of smoking the crude plant may be unacceptable to some and unprofit-

able to others, even though there are some indications that it helps."

Dr. Ingall is the principal investigator for the marijuana research program.

He oversees the clinical approaches of the Department of Public Health's program. The clinical approach involves the study of marijuana in treating the side effects of chemotherapy in cancer patients.

To meet federal requirements for the medical use of marijuana, cancer patients will be divided into two control groups — one group receiving marijuana cigarettes through the State Health Department, and the other receiving the drug Torem, an anti-nausea medication.

Physicians participating in the study

must be licensed by the State Board of Pharmacy and meet federal requirements to use Schedule 1 drugs in Michigan. Schedule 1 are controlled drugs such as heroin and LSD.

Marijuana will be supplied to the State Health Department by the National Institute on Drug Abuse which grows the plant for medical research in Mississippi.

Dr. Ingall's role as principal investigator is to keep files of all physicians licensed to participate in the program, keep files of all patients in the programs, make sure all procedures of the project are followed, act in the program committee as a referee for inclu-

sion of physicians in the program, and deal with clinical problems as they arise.

An evaluation unit will measure the results of the study. An evaluation report to the State Health Department is required at the end of the three-year study.

Anti-nausea properties of marijuana in treating cancer patients on chemotherapy were first identified by researchers in 1971. Since then several studies have been mounted.

The Michigan legislature passed a law last year allowing cancer and glaucoma patients to use marijuana for medical purposes.
