"We feel extremely honored to host them (the national championships)," said Rochester Coach Max Hasse, who has been a longtime fitness booster in the Rochester area.

Last year's national meet was can-celled because General Foods decided to withdraw its sponsorship. However, through the efforts of the Marine Corps and a select number of coaches around the country, the competition was re-vived this spring.

HASSE SERVED on a national panel which helped to reinstate the meet. He co-chaired the panel with Bob Irving of Harrison High School (Colorado Springs, Colo), and they were instrumental in bringing the national meet to Rochester.

Hasse said the national YPF meet was originally scheduled to be held at the Olympic Training Center in Colorado Springs. Because of the controvery surrounding the state of the Olympics and the United States Olympic team, the meet was relocated. Rochester has had a successful background as a YPF participant. With the exception of 1972 and 1979, Rochester High School has qualified as the Midwestern representative at the national meet since 1969. In 1972, Adams High School was the Midwestern representative. The Falcons won the national cham-

When Adams qualified in 1972, the Highlanders — who were missing a key team member because of illness — placed 10th.
