
NEA handed out perfect 100 ratings to Brodhead, Ford and Bonior. It rated Broomfield a zero.


THE HOUSE Republican Research Committee raps the ratings game, according to Roll Call Report. It said:


"Conclusions can be drawn which may indeed do injustice to a member's position, or, on the other hand, provide accolades unjustly deserved," according to the GOP committee.
