

Laker girls finish 2nd

Bloomfield Hills Andover's Kori Gifford collected four first-place finishes in four events, but it was Milford that came out the surprising team winner in the Greater Oakland Activities League (GOAL) girls' track meet Tuesday at Andover.

Milford scored 125 points in the meet to upset favorite West Bloomfield, which finished second with 118½. Milford had only four first-place finishes, while the Lakers had five — including a sweep of all three relays. But Milford's depth was West Bloomfield's undoing.

Finishing third in the team standings was Rochester with 80 points, followed by Andover in fourth (62½). Waterford Kettering fifth (41) and Clarkston sixth (21).

Nothing took the glow off Gifford's outstanding performance. The senior raced to wins in the 100-yard (11.0) and 220-yard (24.5) dashes and took first in the 440-yard run (58.4). She rounded out her day with a leap of 17-4¼ in the long jump, good for another victory.

THERE WERE two other individual double winners in the meet. West Bloomfield's Monique Ozimkowski swept the hurdles, taking the 110-yard-

er (15.4) and the 220-yard event (29.6). Milford's Jenny Clutterbuck dominated the field competition, grabbing top honors in the shot put (36-4) and discus (112-2).

West Bloomfield's Karla Shepler, Cathy Bergoff, Trish Palmer and Vivian McKenzie combined to win both the

440-yard (51.0) and 880-yard (1:46.6) relays. The Lakers' mile team of Jane Perry, Carrie Stinchcomb, Barb Allen and Bergoff also finished first (4:11.9). Other winners were Debbie Grashi of Milford in the high jump (5-5), Rochester's Aimee Landry in the 880-yard run (2:24.2).

North kickers triumph

Sue Pacheco scored two goals and Kris Carl added another last week as North Farmington blanked Bloomfield Hills Andover, 3-0, in the Eastern Division of the North Suburban Girls' Soccer Association.

Janice Higuera and Ann Schans shared the goalkeeping duties for North, which has an 8-2-2 record.

In another recent game, Birmingham Groves' Karen O'Brien scored an unassisted goal to pace her team's 1-0 win over North Farmington. Both teams had eight shots on goal. Farmington High defeated Dearborn Fordson, 4-2, last week in a Western Division contest. The win put Farmington at 3-8-1.

Laura Hollyer, a junior center forward, scored three goals for Farm-

ington, and teammate Mary Burley added another. Mitzie Richardson and Debbie Potter shared the goalkeeping chores for Farmington.

Farmington Harrison and Livonia Franklin played to a scoreless tie last week in another game. Harrison goalie Barb Blumhardt stopped 12 Franklin shots. Her teammates responded with as many on goal.

Earlier, Harrison downed Fordson, 2-0. Sophomore Amy Hixson scored both goals. Harrison coach Al Whittemore used Danielle Jancaak in goal. Harrison, now 2-7-3, plays on May 28 at home against Livonia Bentley. On the same afternoon, West Bloomfield plays at North Farmington in an important Eastern Division game, and Farmington plays at Livonia Franklin.
