## Trustee's Wife Develops New Political Sense

Despite her youth, the role of school trustee's wife rests very well on JoAnn Lichtman, wife of recently elected Farmington Trustee Gary Lichtman.

Also, perhaps because she is still a young woman, the trustee's wife thinks twice before expressing an opinion.

SHE ISN'T HESITANT to voice her pride in her husband, her children, Debbie, 7, Donna, 5, her home, or things for which she is not directly responsible, but she tends to belittle her own accomplishments.

JoAnn bakes, sews, builds things for her home in Meadowlark Subdivision, cares for a well-planned garden, decorates and so on, but comments, "I don't think I'm very good at any of this stuff, but I try it."

She has found that the election of her husband as trustee has broadened her scope of interests.

ALTHOUGH school elections are non-political, she notes, "Politics fascinate me now. I was indifferent before, but now I'm extremely interested."

Part of this interest in things political may stem from the fact that Lichtman's brother, Fred, just won the GOP nomination for township trustee. Gary's wife wouldn't say so, but this almost appears to be the foundation of a new Farmington dynasty.

ACCORDING to his wife, Gary Lichtman has always been interested in education, but "has never been home long enough before, what with national guard duty and completing his education, to pursue the interest before this year."

Both 29 years old, the Lichtmans share the same birth date and have been married eight and one-half years. They married before they completed their educations and while JoAnn was a student at Ohio University. She was an education major, but will not study to be a teacher if she returns to school. "When I go back—and I'm going to—I'm not going for a degree but to educate myself," she says.

ASKED why her husband ran for school trustee, JoAnn Licht-

man weighs her answer cautiously: "Put it this way—sometimes we feel that things need improving and the only way to do it is to go out and do something about it."

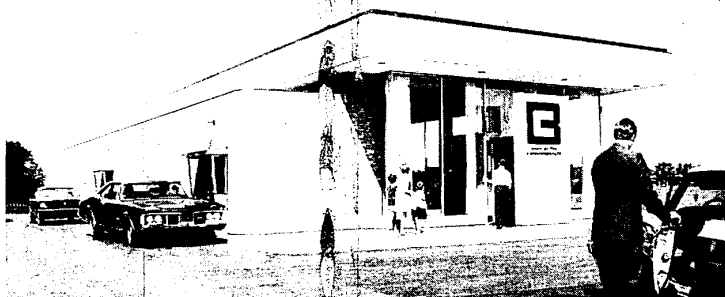

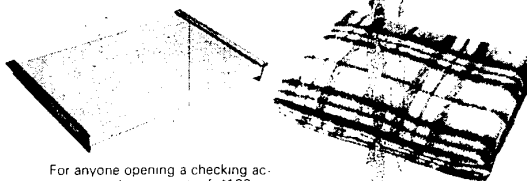

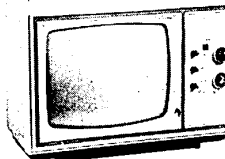
