

Freud files first for circuit court

Varied experience

Michael S. Freud, a Southfield attorney who lives in Keego Harbor, claims he is the first candidate to file nominating petitions for the Aug. 5 Oakland circuit judge primary.

"Being first to file gives my candidacy some real momentum," said Freud, 31, whose 5,000 signatures were 2,000 more than he needed to qualify for a ballot spot.

He seeks to replace incumbent Judge William J. Beer, who is prohibited from seeking re-election because of age. Beer is challenging the constitutionality of the retirement law.

FREUD'S PUBLIC experience in-

cludes work in the state attorney general's office, the state Liquor Control Commission and the prosecutors of Ingham and Oakland counties.

He is now in private practice and says, "I am fortunate to be able to offer Oakland county residents the benefits of a varied background in law. I've been on the prosecution's side, the defendant's side and I've worked on appeals."

An Oakland native, Freud attended Oak Park High School, received a bachelor of science degree from Michigan State University and earned his law degree from Cooley Law School in Lansing.

He said he would use his experience

to help reduce the Oakland court's backlog.

FREUD SAID he would concentrate on pre-trial procedures to eliminate unnecessary trials.

"Judges have available mediation and other procedures to attack the problem of court backlog. Effective use of these procedures can reduce caseloads and also help plaintiffs and defendants avoid long and expensive trials," he said.

Circuit court is the court of general jurisdiction, handling criminal cases, major civil suits and divorce cases. The Oakland circuit has 14 judges. They serve six-year terms.

Parks millage on Aug. 5 ballot

Oakland County voters will be asked Aug. 5 to renew a quarter-mill parks and recreation tax (25 cents per \$1,000 of assessed valuation) for five years.

The County Board of Commissioners last week voted 22-0 without debate to place the millage referendum on the ballot.

Aug. 5 is the primary election for U.S. representatives, county offices and state representatives.

The quarter-mill tax, first approved in 1967, was last renewed by voters for five years in 1976.

THE TAX doesn't expire until Jan. 1, 1982, but the county Parks and Recreation Commission requested the renewal referendum this year because there will be no county-wide elections in 1981.

Eric Reickel, manager of the county parks and recreation department, said the millage provided \$2.2 million in property tax revenue for parks this year.

The millage revenue covers half of the parks operation and maintenance budget and half of the capital improvement (park land acquisition and development) budget, Reickel said.

When the millage was first approved, it generated \$800,000 in revenue, he said.
