Leukemia symposium planned for June 6

The Children's Leukemia Foundation will hold its first leukemia symposium June 6 at Children's Hospital in Detroit.

The event will mark the beginning of activities for Leukemia Week 1980, which is June 6-12.

Children's Hospital of Michigan will be a co-sponsor of the program, in which specialists in serious blood disorders will offer information about diagnosis and medical support.

In addition, psychological factors, available support for patients and the roles of health care professionals will be explored.

Material for the sessions is designed for the non-medical person. Anyone may attend.

A \$6 registration fee will cover admission to all sessions, breaks, lunch and a reception following the day's program. The event will run from 8 a.m. to 4:30 p.m.

Morning sessions will include discussion of chemotherapy, current treatment of acute leukemia, bone marrow transplantation and other subjects. Dr. Joseph Fischhoff will discuss the psychological adaptation to a diagnosis of leukemia in the afternoon. A forum will discuss available support for families.

Leukemia Week is designated each year to present an opportunity to convey the need for continued awareness and to secure support for programs geared to combating leukemia and its allied blood diseases.

Giving blood and blood components, volunteering time and skills, seeking information about serious blood diseases and supporting CLP special events are all ways to support the fight against leukemia.

Events help the foundation raise money to supplement its Torch Drive—United Way allowance.

The Children's Leukemia Foundation will show John Travolta's new movie, "Urban Cowboy," June 12 at Oak Park's Towne Theater.

Movie-only tickets are \$6. Higher-priced patron, sponsor and benefactor tickets entitle the holder to the movie plus an afterglow party at Beth Shalom Synagogue.
