Filmore's new party

The first national convention of the Know Nothing Party was held June 5, 1855 in Philadelphia, Pa. Originally a secret society, the party, also called the American Party, nominated former President Millard Fillmore as its candidate for office in the 1856 election at a convention earlier that year. Fillmore garnered only eight electoral votes.

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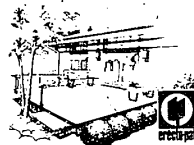
