

Abuses against the elderly to be discussed by panel

A panel on the detection and correction of abuses against the elderly will be at 7:30 p.m. on June 11 at Mercy College of Detroit, 8200 Outer Drive. The event, open to the public and free of charge, is co-sponsored by Mercy College and Radio Station WXYZ. Speakers will be Bernard Chodoroff, a psychiatrist; Richard Douglas, a researcher with the Institute of Gerontology, University of Michigan; and Helen Burton of Adult Protective Services, Michigan Department of Social Services. LaVere Burdette, a psychotherapist, certified marriage counselor and WXYZ talk show host, will act as moderator.

The program is being coordinated by Dr. Jean Kari, director of continuing education at Mercy College. The idea for the panel came when Ms. Burdette was contacted by a nurse who complained of the condition of many of the elderly admitted to the hospital where she worked. "Relatives attributed the black eyes and broken bones to falls, but it was evident to her that these older patients were victims of physical abuse," said Ms. Burdette. After four months of research, Ms. Burdette put together the program with the aid of Mercy College. Chodoroff will discuss the psychological and psychiatric concerns relat-

ed to the aging process as it affects older persons and members of their families. Douglas will disclose some findings from his research on the abuse and neglect of the elderly. Ms. Burton will give step-by-step directions to family members who may be facing for the first time the problem of dealing with an aging relative. Last year Mercy College instituted a gerontology minor where students may obtain a certificate in aging studies and services. It also sponsored a lecture this year by Dr. Barbara Silverstone, author of "You and Your Aging Parent," and Maggie Kuhn, founder of the Gray Panthers.

Immunization clinic comes to Farmington


