



Ecology open house

An all-day festival will be held Saturday to celebrate the opening of the Upland Hills Ecological Awareness Center's new solar heated and wind powered building. Upland Hills is at 2575 Indian Lake Road, Oxford. The "Eco-fair" open from 10 a.m. to 7 p.m., is \$2 for adults, \$1 for the elderly and children, 5-16. Hayrides and folk music will be featured in addition to solar and wind energy demonstrations. Upland Hills' 1,800-square-foot solar-heated, wind-powered building was constructed mostly by volunteers. The non-profit center will be used for workshops, tours and conferences.

Bus fare can be cut for jobless

Southeastern Michigan Transportation Authority (SEMTA) representatives will be meeting with local officials throughout June to urge their participation in a half-fare program for the unemployed.

The seven-county transportation authority's board of directors recently approved a six-month demonstration program to grant the unemployed half-fares during "off-peak" ridership hours Monday through Friday (9 a.m. to 4 p.m. and 6 p.m. to 6 a.m.) and all day Saturdays, Sundays and holidays.

The program will begin July 1, the same day bus fare increases take effect. Full fares will be 60 cents base fare and 20 cents per zone.

THE PROGRAM, however, is contingent on participation from cities, villages and townships in SEMTA's service area, said General Manager Larry E. Satici.

SEMTA wants to sell half-fare passes for \$10 each to each local government that decides to participate in the program.

The municipality has the option of selling the passes or distributing them free. Residents have to show proof of unemployment to obtain or buy a pass. The pass will allow a person to ride any SEMTA bus for half-fare during the month the pass is purchased.

Should a local government distribute the passes free, SEMTA says it can recover the cost through a year-old municipal tax credit program.

Local governments are eligible for a credit equivalent to 20 percent of regional mass transit tax revenues raised in their county.

Residents in Wayne, Oakland and Macomb counties pay an extra fee for license plates and vehicle title transfers. The revenue provides a portion of SEMTA's operating funds.

The amount of each municipality's credit is based on its population share of the county. The credit amount is to be used by local governments to improve transit service within its boundaries.

SHOULD the local government refuse to participate, a SEMTA spokeswoman said this week the program could be operated through a social service agency in the city.

However, it's uncertain whether the agency would be eligible for the tax credit.

For the time being, the spokeswoman said, SEMTA plans to offer the program only through local governments. If an alternative isn't proposed after a government decides not to participate, the program may not be offered in that city or township, she said.
