where she shot her best nine-hole score of the spring (39). She also shot an 82 at Burroughs Farms in the state meet to finish as the second-low medalist.

"She (Malton) consistently drives the ball 200 yards," said Bunetta. "She had seven one-putt greens at the state tournament. She just needs to work on her chipping game a little bit."

McCOLGAN was match medalist in

eight of 15 dual-matches this spring and averaged 48. She shot 36 at the Atlas Valley regional. But the Falcons' team captain birdied her first playoff hole that allowed Rochester to win the regional team title and qualify for the state meet.

McColgan, who has been Rochester's most valuable golfer the past three seasons, will attend Michigan State University on a full basketball scholarship this fall.

"She's (McColgan) a tremendous, all-around athlete, said Bailey. "She is the best girl athlete I've ever seen at Rochester High School."

Johnston averaged 45 and was match medalist 10 times in helping the Highlanders to a 10-4 overall record. She finished eighth in the state with an 89 and won the Atlas Valley regional with an 83.

Evans and Romanski are both sophomores.

Evans, a transfer student from Mount Clemens L'Anse Creuse High School, was team medalist in all 17 of Albens' dual matches. All her scores were less than 50, averaging a sizzling 44.5.

"She (Evans) hits the ball very pure — every one right on the face and right down the middle (of the fairway)," said Red Hawk coach Girard Tarr. "A suspect short game is her only weakness."

ROMANSKI averaged 48.2 for Troy and was match medalist 11 of 15 times. She was fourth at the regional with a 90 and holds the record of 43 at Troy's Sylvan Glen Golf Course.

She helped Troy — which had only two dual-match wins in its first two years — to a 10-4 record this spring. Bailey, who also coaches boys' basketball at Rochester, guided his team to a 13-2 dual-match mark.

The Falcons are consistently among

the top regional contenders. They won their regional at Atlas Valley last month in a special playoff with Grand Blanc. Rochester finished eighth in the state with a team score of 393.

Members of the O&E's second-team squad include Jeanne Gibbons (Kingswood), Lindy Kosak (Birmingham Mar-ian), Ann Laster (Birmingham Groves), Dara Stevens (West Bloomfield), Sandy Thomas (Bloomfield Hills Andover) and Sheryl Walden (Rochester).

Pitch, Hit and Run set

The City Council of the City of Farmington Hills held a special meeting June 2, 1980. A study session was held at 7:00 p.m. Fitness Tract Presentation by Cadette Girl Scout Troop No. 419.

A necessity was declared for road improvement on Thirteen Mile Road from Halsted to Haggerty, Inkster Road from Northwestern Highway to Thirteen Mile Road and Nine Mile Road from western subdivision line of Meadow Hills Estates to I-75.
