Suntime benefit unveils fall fashions

A fantasy package for the home features fresh flowers and hors d'oeuvres for a year as well as a valuable art object. Restaurateur Duglass and jewelry designer Marc Spoutz will combine their talents. Their package includes dinner for two at Duglass with a desert course featuring an ice carving containing an emerald and diamond necklace.

A more casual dinner package features a party for 100 at the Stroh House and all the Stroh's beer a hundred people can drink.

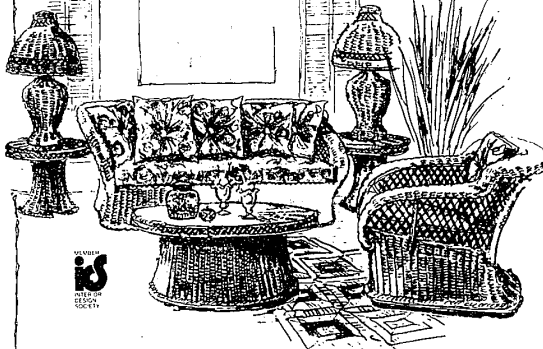

What is tempeh?

Make your own. Here's an easy recipe to adapt to your own tastes:

Tempeh (pronounced TEM-pay) is a high-protein food product made from soybeans that have been bound together by a fermentation process that produces a compact white cake about one-half inch thick.

Sold fresh or frozen, tempeh is a delicious alternative to meat. You can use tempeh to make tempeh burgers or tempeh chops. Pureed, it makes creamy dressing or spreads. Sliced or cubed tempeh is delicious in soups or salads. Among tempeh purists, the favorite and simplest way of serving it is deep fried and seasoned with coriander or garlic.

Can you recommend an alternative to commercial ice cream?

Blender Ice Cream

2 cups fruit of your choice
1 cup heavy cream
1/2 cup honey
1 teaspoon lemon juice
Place fruit, honey and lemon juice in blender. Cover and blend for about one minute. Whip cream with electric mixer. Fold whipped cream into fruit mixture and blend well. Put into a one-quart freezer container and freeze until firm but not hard, about 40 minutes. Whip again with electric mixer until fluffy. Return to freezer until solid. Let stand at room temperature a few minutes before serving. Makes 4-6 servings.

Eco-Tip: Fruit and vegetable peelings used as compost will improve your garden soil.

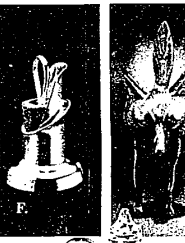
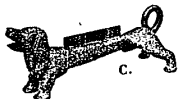

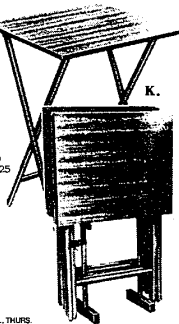
