ing the rules, can improve his game. With numerous examples and illustrations, Watson offers suggestions that will help both beginners and experts plan strategies for winning golf.

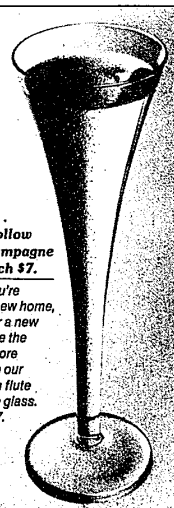
