

Grosse Pointe ends Franklin's baseball hopes

One key hit. That's what kept Livonia Franklin from advancing to the state Class A baseball finals.

The scrappy Patriots were eliminated from the quarterfinals Monday

afternoon at Hazel Park, 6-4, by No. 1 ranked Grosse Pointe North, now 27-4 overall.

Franklin advanced to the regional championship earlier in the day with an 8-2 win over Warren Mont in a game that had been suspended because of rain since Saturday.

"I don't know if we came up flat," said Franklin coach Gerald Cullin, whose team bowed out of the tourney with a 17-8 record.

"I'm disappointed in losing," he said, "but we came along way. This is the scrappiest bunch of kids around. They fight until the last out."

Franklin had its chances on numerous occasions against the Norsemen.

Trailing by three runs, Franklin loaded the bases in the top of the sixth inning. North pitcher Tom Shook, however, got out of the jam with a strike out. On deck was Franklin's outstanding hitter, center fielder Herb

McManaway.

"We tried to get Herb up there," said Cullin. "We just couldn't get the key hit."

FRANKLIN REFUSED to die in the top of the seventh.

McManaway led off the inning with a cannon-like inside-the-park homer past center field to cut the margin to 6-4.

Dave Rettig and DH Bill Yeates then reached base on walks, but Bill Babcock, who tossed a no-hitter against Detroit Northwestern in Saturday's regional semifinal, came on to get the final out, throwing three consecutive fire-brand strikes.

"I'm happy the way we held our poise," said North coach Frank Sumner. "Franklin is a very disciplined team. They bunted effectively and never quit."

North looked awesome in the first inning, scoring three runs, one unearned, against Franklin's lefty Ralph Schaff. Franklin came back with two runs of its own in the third. Second baseman Larry Rotter reached base on an error and came home on McManaway's line-drive triple.

North then upped the lead to 4-2 in

the fourth when Bob Brown walked, stole second and raced home on catcher Mike Seagram's RBI double.

Seagram, who hit two homers against Northwestern, went 3-for-3 and scored two runs. Brown, a shortstop, scored three runs and had two hits.

Area crew member heads for nationals

Chris Dwyer of Farmington is a member of the Grand Valley State College varsity women's crew, which has been invited to the national rowing championships, July 18-22, in Oakridge, Tenn.

The Laker women will compete in two events starting with the Collegiate Championship, June 18-19, and then the National Women's Rowing Association Regatta, June 20-22. Both events will be held at the same Oakridge site.

Coach Paul Springer's Grand Valley rowers have posted a 21-3 record and are rated one of the top 20 teams in the country. Grand Valley won the Midwest Rowing championship for the seventh-straight year earlier this spring.

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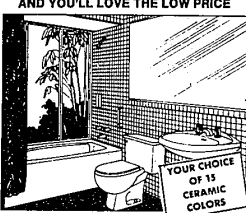
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
