The longest standing record in the history of the American Bowling Congress tournament was broken during the recent meet in Louisville, but it passed without any fanfare.

It came when Mike Eaton, of Grand Rapids, put together games of 245, 258 and 279 for a 782 series. This shattered

the mark set by the late Lee Jouglaire when he posted a 775 series as a member of the Detroit Strikers team in 1951. After setting the record, Lee went on to earn a place in the ABC Hall of Fame.

Thousands of bowlers have slid down the approaches since Jouglaire played the hero role in one of the most emo-

tional dramas in ABC history. He knew he had to roll a 278 game to set the mark and did it under extreme pressure.

That it was on the books for 29 years is proof his performances that afternoon was a classic. However, it was not the highest series ever rolled in the ABC. It was until the Classic was introduced and the pros made eligible. When that happened Mickey Higdon, of Kansas City, registered an 801 in 1977.

IN A RECENT column, it was mentioned that Dick Beattie, the southpaw who dominated the Detroit bowling scene last season, had six different bowling balls with him when he won the Masters at Bowlero.

This prompted a reader to inquire if that was a record. There is nothing list-

ed officially, but it is a record for a challenge match. That honor belongs to a fellow named Jake Bonze, a portly window washer whose specialty was head to head battles.

On a cold winter day some years ago, he challenged Pete Carter, then an all-star bowler, to a marathon at the old Detroit Recreation. They started at noon and about every hour or two, when his thumb started to swell, Jake ordered a new ball drilled.

When he finally admitted, after 84 games, that he couldn't go on, he had six new balls drilled - and he didn't keep any of them. As far as it's known, no one has beaten that mark.

BILL WINKEL, owner of Bel-Aire Lanes, has come up with something new in promotion of the tenpin game.

He has organized what he calls the inflation fighters league. And thus far he has quite a few enterers.

It is a mixed league where he is charging only \$1 entry fee plus the cost of bowling.

SUMMARY OF PROCEEDINGS
CITY COUNCIL MEETING
JUNE 9, 1980**

The City Council of the City of Farmington Hills held a regular meeting June 9, 1980. Mayor Soronen opened the meeting at 7:30 p.m. Members present were: Burwell, Lange, Oppert, Wolk, Alkateeb and Dolan. Others present were: City Manager Savage, City Clerk Cairns and City Attorney Bibace.

Council approved the May 27, 1980 Council minutes.

Council enacted the following Zoning Amendment Ordinances: C62-207 located between Farmington Road and Cass to rezone from RA-1 to OS-2 parcel 23-347-023 in the SE 1/4 of Section 33; C62-208 parcel 23-12-126-038 in the NW 1/4 of Section 12 rezoned from RA-1A to OS-3; C62-211 parcel 23-12-126-041 in the NW 1/4 of Section 12 rezoned from RA-1 to OS-3; C62-212 parcels 23-105-009, 017, 020 through 023 and 026 in the NW 1/4 of Section 2 rezoned from RA-4 to OS-1; and C62-213 parcel 23-105-007 and 008 in the NW 1/4 of Section 4 to rezone from RA-4 to OS-1.

The Ordinance No. C-4-80 to amend anti-blight regulations was enacted.

The public hearing date for road improvement on Inkster Road from Northwestern to Thirteenth Mile Road was set for July 21, 1980 and the resolution of Notice of Intention to issue \$53,800 Inkster Road Improvement Special Assessment Bonds was adopted.

The Cost Public Hearing date for road improvement on Nine Mile was set for July 21, 1980 and the Notice of Intention to issue Nine Mile Road Special Assessment Bonds was approved.

Notice of Intention to issue Thirteenth Mile Road Improvement Special Assessment Bonds was approved for publication.

General Fund Budget for fiscal 1980/81 was approved in the amount of \$12,023,536, @ \$5 mills.

The request from the developer of Bridle Hills Subdivision for extension of completion of Open Space Plan was extended to September 1, 1981.

Council approved the resolution consenting to the Transfer of Employment re: L & B Machine Tool and N & W Sales and Engineering requested by Howell Township Economic Development Corporation.

Neighborhood Watch to be presented to Council in the next 30 days.

Approval was given to refund of special assessment charges for construction of sewer in Briar Hill Subdivision SAD C109, in the amount of \$7,735, to record owners as of June 9, 1980.

Approval was given to contract with Gradall Rental Service, Inc., for \$9,880 and Main Sand and Gravel for \$7,630, for City utility.

Approval was given to purchase two intermediate 2-door passenger vehicles for the Police Department from Bob Saks thru his bid being low.

Approval was given to refund all S.A.D. excess, ninety days after actual construction is completed.

A study session will be held July 7, 1980 re Mercy property.

SUMMARY OF PROCEEDINGS
CITY COUNCIL MEETING
May 27, 1980**

The City Council of the City of Farmington Hills held a special meeting May 27, 1980. Mayor Soronen opened the meeting at 7:30 p.m. Members present were: Burwell, Lange, Oppert, Wolk, Alkateeb and Dolan. Others present were: City Manager Savage, City Clerk Cairns, City Attorney Bibace and Planning Consultant Coates.

Council approved the minutes of March 24, 1980 and the May 12, 1980, minutes.

Request to rezone parcels 23-01-376-010, 011 and 378-015 in Section 1 from RA-1 to OS-1 was denied.

Amendatory Ordinance C62-207 parcel of land in SE 1/4 of Section 33; 23-33-477-023 located on Eight Mile Road between Farmington Road and Cass to rezone from RA-3 to OS-2 was introduced.

Council introduced Amendatory Ordinance C62-208 in the NW 1/4 of Section 12 part of 23-12-126-038, 29201 Davis Lane request to rezone from RA-1A to OS-3.

Amendatory Ordinance C62-209, request to rezone 23-12-227-008 in NE 1/4 of Section 12, corner of Thirteenth Mile Road and Inkster from RA-1A to RA-1 was denied.

Council denied the request to rezone 23-36-281-005 in the NE 1/4 of Section 36 C62-210 from RA-4 to B-1.

Amendatory Ordinance C62-211 in the NW 1/4 of Section 12, 23-12-126-041 to rezone from RA-1A to OS-3 was introduced.

Amendatory Ordinance C62-212 in the NW 1/4 of Section 2, lots 12 through 19 and lots 37 and 38 of Block D of Farmington Heights Subdivision to rezone from RA-4 to OS-1 was introduced.

Amendatory Ordinance C62-213 in the NW 1/4 of Section 2, parcel 23-2-105-007 and 008 request to rezone from RA-4 to OS-1 was introduced.

Approval was given to barricade Road and Pinewood at the alleys separating the Subdivision from the business area bordering Orchard Lake Road.

Council approved the site plan for multiples with dedication of open space "F" and escrow of \$4,000 and completion by 10-01-80, Rambleswood Tanglewood Lake Estates in Section 5.

The following rezonings were enacted:

C62-203, SW 1/4 of Section 36 parcel 23-36-356-005 and 009 located on Eight Mile Road between Roosevelt and Pearl to rezone from RA-3 to B-3 and P-1.

C62-204 in the SE 1/4 of Section 36 parcels 23-36-430-001, 003, 004 and 404-003 rezone from RA-4 to SP-2.

C62-205 in the NE 1/4 of Section 18 parcel 14 of the s'y 280' of 23-18-200-213 8.6A on the W side of Halsted between Howard Road and Twelve Mile Road rezone from RA-1 to L-1.

The City Code was amended by enactment of Amendatory Ordinance C-2-80 Section 80-430 re Trespassing on Residential Property and Amendatory Ordinance C-3-80 Section 20-325 re Residential Driveway Slopes.

Council approved the resolution approving the Project Area and Project District Area for Hunters Square Project as recommended by the Economic Development Corporation.

Approval was given to the resolution requesting appointment of two additional directors to the Economic Development Corporation for Hunters Square and the Mayor's appointment of Harlem Morris and Ralph C. Wise were approved.

Approval was given to the resolution approving the Project Area and Project District Area, for Roson Company Project, recommended by the Economic Development Corporation and the Mayor's appointment of Harlem Morris and Ralph C. Wise for the two additional directors to the Economic Development Corporation for Roson Company Project was approved.

Council approved the resolution approving Project Area and Project District Area for Carrefour Corporation Project as recommended by Economic Development Corporation and the Mayor's appointment of Harlem Morris and Ralph C. Wise to the Economic Development Corporation for the Carrefour Corporation Project.

June 16, 1980 was set for public hearing for street vacation V-140 of Section 35 Westminster and Yorkshire.

Public Hearing was set for Alley Vacation V-2-80 in Section 35, the alley north of lots 29 through 28 inclusive of Assessor's Grand River Homes State Subdivision for June 16, 1980.

Approval was given the request from John Robert Langan and Thomas J. Langan, Jr. to drop Thomas J. Langan, Sr., deceased, as partner in 1980 Class C licensed business with Dance Permit and Entertainment Permit for movies only, located at 32905 Northwestern Highway.

The District was established for Water Improvement in West Gate Franklin Village Subdivision and the Necessity Hearing date was set for June 16, 1980.

Council introduced Ordinance C-4-80 as amendment to the City Code to amend the anti-blight regulations.

Recently Public Hearings were set for June 2, 1980 for Thirteenth Mile Road Improvement and related to Hagerty and Nine Mile Road improvement from 1275 easterly and Inkster Road improvement from Northwestern to Thirteenth Mile Road.

Council adopted Traffic Control Order I.D. 16-80 for the installation of a traffic signal at Nine Mile and Hagerty, in accordance with Oakland County Control Order TS 345-12-80.

Council approved the installation of traffic signal at Ten Mile and Grand River city's participation for the cost at 1/3 of the total cost of installation of \$9,780 or \$3,263 from Major Road Funds and the City Officials be authorized to enter into an agreement with Oakland County Road Commission.

Meeting adjourned.
