Notice is hereby given that a public hearing will be delt by the Southeastern Michigan Transportation Authority (SEMTA) in the 13th floor Board Room, First National Building, 560 Woodward Avenue, Detroit, Michigan at 12:00 Noon EUST, Monday, 1014, 7, 1959, for the purpose of considering a project for which financial assistance is being snoght under Section 3 of the Urban Mass Transportation Act of 1964, as amended, generally described as Oliver.

DESCRIPTION OF PROJECT:

1. The project generally consists of the preliminary design of a light rail transit system within the Woodward Avenue certifor from Downtown Detroit to Royal Oak. The design effort is intended to determine how the system might be constructed. To design the constructed of the present of the prese

2. The equipment will be owned and operated by SEMTA.

The estimated project cost is \$24,000,000 80%, of the funding or \$19,800,000 is proposed to be provided by the Federal government. The remaining 20% will be provided by the State of Michigan.

This project will add no adverse effect on the environment.

COMPREHENSIVE PLANNING:
This project is in conformance with comprehensive land use and transportation planning in this area.

The system will be designed to accommodate the elderly and handicapped in accord with applicable federal and state regulations.

At the hearing, Semta will afford an opportunity for interested persons or agencies to be heard with respect to the social, economic and environmental aspect of the project. Interested persons may submit orally or in writing evidence and recommendations with respect to said project.
