Shafer has been on the HCMA board for four years. Other HCMA officers include Thomas Welsh, Macomb County public works di-rector, chairman, and Jeanette S. Weiss, a governor appointee, treas-Edmund N. Orbeck, the state's com-missioner of labor, urged job seekers to seek jobs elsewhere or stay where they're at, "because there is not an abundance of jobs to be had in the

state."

Orbeck said the unemployment rate in the state is one of the highest in the nation at 11 percent and in some parts 20 percent. The cost of living also remains high.

Because of the current economic sit-uation in many parts of the U.S., Alaskan workers who are employed are staying at their jobs. As a result, job openings due to turnover are down.

"The recent publicity about Alaska doing away with income tax is some-what misleading." Orbeck said, "be-cause an employee must file state re-turns for three years to be totally ex-empt from state income taxes.

"No final decisions have been made on construction of the Alaska Natural Gas Pipeline, and construction is not foreseen until the mid-80s.

"If the line is built, there are already more than enough workers living in Alaska to fill all but the most technical jobs," he said.
