## Where to camp in Oakland county

'Summer camping is becoming a way of life for many families in Michigan. But with rising energy costs, many are seeking campgrounds that are closer to home.

Groveland Oaks County Park near Holly offers 600 campsites, 350 with water and electricity, and 250 without. Fifty of the sites with water and electricity are new. Camping facilities are available at Groveland Oaks for both tents and recreational vehicles.

The park is situated on 200 acres surrounding Stewart Lake. According to park supervisor Clyde Herb, Groveland Oaks is one of the largest campsites in the tri-county area.

Last summer, attendance at the park totaled 35,000 trailers and 30,000 vehicles, according to Herb.

"Many people," he said, "spend quite

a bit of time here, some for two or three weeks or longer."

He said that a few families make the park their summer home and commute to work.

Services at Groveland Oaks include a park mini-store where food staples and supplies are available, a concession stand, public telephones, drinking water and restrooms.

Recreational activities at Groveland Oaks include volleyball, basketball and arts and crafts. Square dances are held in the pavilions, and each Tuesday evening there's a movie in the park's natural amphitheater.

The park is completely fenced for security. The front gate is staffed 24 hours a day to ensure further safety.

Groveland Oaks includes three is-

lands in Stewart Lake. They are used mostly for group activities such as family reunions, company picnics and weddings. The islands are open to the public during the week for picnics.

Rowboats, pedalboats and canoes are all available for rent. There are grassy playfield areas for softball, a children's playground, horseshoe pits and a man-made wading pool. There's also fishing in Stewart Lake.

Non-denominational church services are held each Sunday during summer months.

Camping fees for Oakland County residents are \$5 per family per day on the old sites, \$6 on the new sites. Non-Oakland County residents must pay a \$1 surcharge. All electrical sites are \$1 extra.

Camping fees are reduced by 50 per-

cent for senior citizens and retirees Sunday through Thursday.

There is a minimum of 10 units for group reservations. Oakland County resident youth groups are charged 50 cents per person per day. The fee for non-resident groups is 75 cents per person per day.

Vehicle entry permits are available for \$7 from Oakland County Parks and Recreation. They entitle a vehicle's occupants to continuous entry through 1980 at Groveland Oaks, Independence Oaks and Addison Oaks. Vehicle entry permits may be purchased at the Oakland County Parks and Recreation Administration office, 2800 Watkins Lake Road in Pontiac.

Groveland Oaks is off Dixie Highway - US 10 - near Holly. Call 634-9811 for more information.

## Maher's slam ignites Lynch baseballers

Jeff Maher's seventh-inning grand slam home run sparked a 3-2 come-from-behind victory for Birmingham Lynch and Sons Monday night at Jaycee Park in Pontiac.

Pontiac 'A' League foe Emory's Catering was the victim, as Lynch remained the only undefeated team in league action.

Emory broke a scoreless tie in the top of the seventh inning, scoring its only two runs of the game for a 2-0 lead.

But five Lynch runs in the bottom half of the inning was the difference.

Lynch's John Mugaridichian started the game with a walk. He moved to second base when Bruno Petrella was safe on an infield error.

Jim Maertens, running for Mugaridichian, beat the throw to third base on Mike Cullen's sacrifice bunt. Cullen, a Birmingham Brother Rice graduate and member of Florida State's College World Series-bound baseball team, was safe at first base on this fielder's choice to load the bases.

Chuck Wagner filed deep to left field to score Maertens on the sacrifice fly to make it 2-1. The other two runners

advanced one base on that fly out, so John Nolen was intended to score.

Camping fees were intended to be used to re-load the bases — setting the stage for Maher's game-ending heroics.

BRIAN YOUNG, pitching in relief of Bill Nolen and Jim Milford, registered the victory, despite his shaky seventh inning. He hit two batters, walked one and gave up a hit in that stanza.

In his 3½ innings of relief, Young struck out three. He relieved Milford in the fourth inning, after Milford had walked the bases full with two out. Young came in and struck out Emory's

Dave Nuss to protect the scoreless tie. Starter Nolen worked the first three innings, striking out five and allowing two hits.

LAST THURSDAY, Lynch ripped Adray Appliance, 10-3, in a non-league contest.

Petrella led the attack with three hits. Tim Scheurer, Maertens and Bill Hyde added two hits each. Maloney belted a two-run home run, and Jim Price added a run-scoring triple to spark the 12-hit attack.

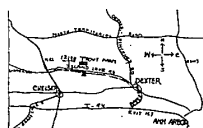
