Music editor job brings close-up of celebrities

Working in Hollywood is exciting for Curt Sobel, originally from Southfield and now a supervising music editor for La Da Productions.

NOW A RESIDENT of Marina del Rey in Los Angeles, Curt Sobel owns a house in Southield with his brother Michael, who is an assistant prosecutor in Oakland County. His sister Margo is working on a summer teaching program at the Michigan School for the Blind in Lansing.

All three Sobels went to the University of Michigan, where Margo is a senior. Their parents, Millford and Gloria Sobel, live at Country Corners in Southfield.

"I moved there to look for a composing job in film," Sobel said. When he
found it tough to break into that aspect
of the music business, Sobel decided to
switch to editing.

La Da Productions is an independent
music editing company, used by producers who make their own films.
"None of them have editing services,
so they hire us to work on films," he
said.

Before going to Hollywood, Sobel studied music at Berklee College in

AT BERKLEE, he edited shorts and student films, as well as composed songs. In the summer of 1978, he composed the music for "Tattoo," a film about professional tattoo artists. "Tattoo" won an award at the Miami Film Festival.

Sobel said he has always worked in hospitals and was a secretary in a hospital for six months when, "One day I felt, It's now or never."
That's when he declided to go to Califordia to pursue his music career. There he met Dan Carlin Jr., whose father is "a well-respected music editor in follywood," running La Da Productions.

There are five stage in music editing, Sobel explained. First is spotting the show, with the composer, director and producer.

"We get together and talk about

producer.
"We get together and talk about where the music should go."
Second is the breakdown. The music editor gets a dupe of the picture and breaks down the scenes that will have music.
"He gives them to the composer, who writes the music with those sheets, second by sufficeation!"

writes the music with those sheets, second by spilt second."
THIRD IS scoring, recording the music with the composer and orchestra and one of the independent studios.
"I do everything except conduct the orchestra. They just have to be concrened with what the orchestra sounds like. This is the most from stage." Fourth is building, all the music is recorded, transferred on 35mm film. "Building the music track, to run in synch on tape recorder with the picture."

Fifth and last is dubbing, or mixing, all the sounds are mixed together: the dialogue, sound effects and music.



SOBEL SAID "Falling in Love Again" starring Elliot Gould and Su-zannah York, has not yet been released. "It's a romantic comedy, and Michel's music makes it very lush and roman-tic"

very, very lucky," Sobel said.




Curt Sobel describes the five stages in music editing, his specialty, for movies and television. (Staff photo by Stephen Cantrell)
