OCC purchase boosts allied health program

Graduates set to benefit

"This points up why it's so expensive to have vocational-technical pro-grams," said Trustee David Hackett as the Oakland Community College Board last week purchased more than \$178,000 in equipment.

The equipment will be used in the al-lied health program, to be housed in a building going up on Nine Mile in Southfield.

The program trains persons in fields felated to health care. "These gradu-ates make \$18,000 a year the day they're out of school," said OCC Presi-dent Robert F. Roelofs.
