San Marino, at 26534 Halstead
Road in Farmington, is a nine-hole
golf course. Total yardage for the
course is 3,300, and par is 36.
The longest hole at San Marino is
the par 5, 515-yard ninth hole. The
most difficult hole, however, is the
par 4, 390-yard fifth hole. The fifth
is a good driving hole, requiring the
golfer to hit a straight tee shot down
a narrow fairway bordered by

golier to hit a straight tee shot down a narrow fairway bordered by woods on either side. Facilities at San Marino include a pro shop and snack bar. The course has both electric and pull carts for

rent.
San Marino is open to both Farmington residents and non-residents.
