Girl Scouts Will Study Animal Care

An upcoming television show, "At the Zoo," will announce an exciting opportunity for girls in South Oakland. The Detroit Zoological Park and Southern Oakland Girl Scouts are working together in a newly created Animal Care Aide course for Senior Scouts.

Dr. Robert F. Wilson, zoo director; William Austin, educational director; and Keith Kresig, general curator, in cooperation with Mrs. Peter Dawson, Girl Scout program director, have developed a program which includes training in animal exhibits, research and education.

The course, held on Saturdays in February and March at the zoo's Administrative Building will cover the principles behind zoo operations and animal care. Austin and Kresig will place special emphasis on learning about mammals, reptiles and birds.

Upon completion of the course the Scouts will be qualified to work as guides at the zoo and each will give at least 50 hours of service on Saturdays throughout the coming spring and summer.
