'Hercules' in the heavens during this month

On July evenings, the constellation of Hercules and its great globular star cluster are found nearly directly overhead, says University of Michigan astronomy Prof. Richard G. Teske. "From earlist times, this star pat-tern has been identified with national heroes or gods in the tales of many cul-tures. In Greek legend, Hercules was the courageous, exceedingly strong son of Zeus whose rowly exploits included battling the Nemean Lion and estab-"Lishing the Nemean Lion and establishing the Olympic Games."

This object in the Hercules constellation is an altogether different kind of star cluster from the familiar Pleiades and Hyades groupings of late winter skies, says the UM astronomer. "It is much larger than they are and contains perhaps a half-million stars — many times more than they do.

"Astronomers call such, large populous assemblages 'globular clusters,' and have located over 100 of them that are a part of the galaxy in which our sun resides.

"Studies of these huge stellar congregations have shown that they are those to diest objects in nearby space," Says Teste. graphs, the stars seem to appear tight-ly packed together. Teske says this is an illusion. "Even near the cluster's very core, the stars are about a light-year apart, and there is little danger of collisions."

What would our night sky be like if we lived on a planet circling a star inside of the Hercules cluster?

"The appearance of the heavens would be a pageant of countless glittering stars, ranging in brilliance from the quarter moon to the brightest stars were seen in our own sky today," Teske says.

"The bright stars would throw multiple shadows on the ground, and there would be no real darkness at night."
