Artistic skating, which includeds figures and dance competition, will begin tomorrow and conclude July 8. The speed skaters will then take over the Troy skating facility for the final two days of competition — July 9-10.

"I think we have a very good shot at the regional titled," said Martin, a former speed skater. "But, Ohio is very strong. It seems like whenever Ohio and Michigan get together it's a battle, and this competition won't be any different."
