# Suburbs cool to judge's water board seat plan

GEORGE KUHN: critic of DWSD management

U.S. District Judge John Feikens has proposed suburban communutes par-ticipate in choosing the three suburban representatives on the Detroit Board of

representatives on the Detroit Board of Water Commissioners.
He got a cool reception from an Oakland County spokesman.
And Detroit officials may oppose Feikens' having approval over the appointment and dismissal of suburban

Feikens, chief U.S. judge for eastern being and the suburban water baord members week that Oakland, Wayne and Macomb counties nominate three persons each for their respective seats on the seven-member water board. Detroit Mayor Coleman Young would select three of the nine suburban nominees, subject to Feikens' confirmation.

suburban nominees, subject to Feikens' confirmation. Young now appoints all seven water commissioners without consulting the suburbs. The board sets water and sever rates for the Detroit Water and Sewerage Department (DWSD). Feiser is proposal would not affect the appointment of the four Detroit commissioners.

OAKLAND COUNTY Drain Commissioner George Kuhn, long-time critic of DWSD management, said Feikens' proposal "could be tokenism."

proposal "could be tokenism."
He added: "We're going to try to work within the (water board) framework... I don't think it's going to resolve the problems."
Kuthn has organized a petition drive that seeks a popular vote to replace the water board with a regional board that would diminish Detroit's control. He failed to gather enough signatures to place a referendum on the November ballot, but has set a 1982 deadline.

DWSD has nearly 100 suburban community water customers and more than 70 suburban swerr customers. Feikens' proposal would become part of an amended court agreement between the city, U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) and Michigan Department of Natural Resources (DNR).

That agreement — first reached in September 1977 — has been revised to give the Detroit sewage treatment plant more time to meet federal anti-pollution guidelines. The EPA sued De-

troit over pollution of the Detroit River and Lake Erie.

OAKLAND COUNTY objects to the revised agreement, which was signed Monday by Feikens.
The county, represented by Kuhn and Atty, William Hampton, of Farmington Hills, wanted Feikens to apoint a review or "watchdog" committee, which would have monitored DWSD's budget and rate-making decisions.
Feikens had considered such a committee earlier this year, but later dropped the idea. He said Monday that a review committee would only dupli-

ater commissioners. Feikens granted Hampton's request

"We have to work the mechanics out," Hampfons aid.

It hasn't been determined whether the county board of commissioners, county drain commissioner or (in Oakland County) the county executive would propose the suburban nominees to Young.


