# Farmington Glen slips by foe

Jim Vik, Alec Campbell and Dawn Stanton each established a team record to help Farmington Glen Swim Club slide past Rochester Heart of the Hills, 284-283, in a recent Northwest Suburban Swim League meet. Glenn owns a 3-0 record.

Stanton finished the 50-meter backstroke for 15- to 17-year-old girls in 33.94 seconds for one record. Campbell smashed the record in the boys' 13-14 year butterfly with a time of 29.5, and then won the freestyle event in 27.90. Vik, swimming in the 9-and-10 but-

fly, won with a record 36.93. He also won the 11-12 fly in 36.10.

Cindi Mell and Mike Pelon each won two events for Farmington Glen. Swimming in the 13-14 age group, Pelon won the 100-meter individual medley (1:14.59) and the 50-meter breaststroke (37.69). Mell won the 15-17 breast (37.57) and the 13-14 breast (37.36).

Kelly Snydes was a double winner for Heart of the Hills, posting times of 1:22.24 in the 100-meter IM for 11-12 girls and 41.74 in the 50-meter

breaststroke for 11-12 girls. Heart of the Hills has a 2-1 record.

In another NSSL meet, Bloomfield Surf defeated Woodbrooke Hills, 337-232.

Woodbrooke Hills' Scott Stinson, swimming in the 11-12 group, won the 50-meter freestyle (30.05) and the 50-meter breaststroke (40.25). Teammate Jason Wolf won two events in the 9-and-10 group, the 50 freestyle (33.12) and the 50 backstroke (38.42, a club record).

Kathy Pierog set another Wood-

brooke Hills record with a 1:19.1 in the girls' 11-12 100-meter IM. Kristin Kranz logged another record for the losers with a 34.56 in the 9-and-10 freestyle.

Woodbrooke Hills' 52-year combined age medley relay (Helen Sue Howard, Jill Anderson, Pierog and Colleen Carey) broke their own pool record by four seconds with a winning time of 2:16.69.

Natalie Kroovand, swimming in the 8-and-under group for Bloomfield Surf, won the 25-meter breaststroke (23.97) and the 25-meter butterfly (20.03).

## Legion '9' falters

Paul Fortuna singled with the bases loaded Sunday to cap Royal Oak's 11-10 come-from-behind victory in nine innings over Farmington in American Legion 18th District baseball at Royal Oak's Memorial Park.

Farmington, which fell to 9-6 this season, entered the bottom of the ninth inning with a 10-7 lead. Jeff Drodzowski, the last of five Royal Oak pitchers, was the winner. Jim Whitworth took the loss.

Farmington produced 11 hits, including three by Bruce Morrison. Teammate Pete Tompson doubled and singled to drive in three runs, bringing his season RBI total to 17.

Earlier, Farmington split an 18th District doubleheader with Bloomfield Hills, losing the first game (3-0) and winning the nightcap (4-3) in eight innings.

Morrison singled home the winning run in the second game. Whitworth worked the entire eight in-

ings, allowing just three hits, striking out four and walking three.

Bloomfield Hills mound ace John Sillick allowed Farmington two hits — singles by Morrison and Rex Baker — in the opener. He struck out three and walked two. Bill Ebert went two for three and scored two runs.

Steve Rutkowski, the losing pitcher, worked 6 1/2 innings and allowed three runs on three hits.

Three Farmington players — pitchers Mike Tetreault and Rutkowski and outfielder Dave Schultz — have been named to the 18th District all star team, which will play the 16th (Downriver) District stars at 7:30 p.m. on Saturday at Wynant's Memorial Park, Pennsylvania and 50th.


