## Michigan trails in retail trade Places to eat are more common than any other type of retail establishment, both in Michigan and nationwide, according to Verway. In 1977, eating establishments in the state employed 142,000 people, or 27 precreat of all retail employees: but because they are so labor intensive, they accounted for only 7 percent of the retail sales in the state.

In what may come as no surprise to Michigan residents, the state ranks first in new car registrations per capita and the control of those cars are Americando of those cars are Americando of the cars are American Carlon of the cars, the overall gain in retail trade lags behind the rest of the nation, according to David I. Verway, a research professor in the Graduate School of Business Administration at Michigan State University.

Statistics compiled by the Census of Retail Trade grew by 55 percent between 1972 and 1977. lagging behind the national average of 58 percent. That puts Michigan 12th from the bottom if the states are ranked from the biggest increases to the least increases.

According to Verway, grocery store sales in the state increased by 39 percent during that five-year period, much below the national average of 58 percent, and that's the main reason overall sales lagged behind the national average.

Michigan's interest in buying Ameri-can-made cars is seen in several other statistics, said Verway. For one, the state ranked 42nd in registrations for new imported cars. In addition, the Bu-reau of Labor Statistics reports that vehicle purchases accounted for 8.9 percent of a Detroit Household's total expenditures, compared with 7.4 per-cent for urban households in the nation as a whole.

And sales of used cars in the state were depressed compared with sales in other states. High saleries and lower new car prices are the reason, Verway said.
