The merger of the American Junior Bowling Congress and the Youth Bowling Association moved a step closer last week at the proprietors' national convention in Las Vegas.

The proprietors, who organized the Youth Bowling group almost two decades ago to provide opposition for the AJBC, voted unanimously to join forces with the ABC that was sponsored years ago by the American Bowling Congress.

All that remains now is for the American Bowling Congress to favor the combine and it could go into effect for the 1980-81 season.

Recently the Women's International Bowling Congress voted for the combine, but only after it first turned it down and then headed a plea from Mrs. Alberta Crowe, the national president. Mrs. Crowe surprised her convention when she turned the gavel over to her vice-president and then took the floor to plead for the joint program.

The big surprise was the proprietors' approval in that they had been the sponsors of a program that not only included leagues on the local level but also instituted the National Youth tournament that was held in Washington, D.C., for many years.

If the ABC approves the merger, the youth association will be one of the biggest groups in the bowling game.
