



## Help available for those with credit problems

With thousands of unemployed workers in the Detroit area, delinquencies on mortgages, loans and bills are skyrocketing. Unfortunately, with very little sign of relief in the local recession, delinquencies will continue to increase. However, while incomes are down, there are still ways of appeasing creditors.

John P. Fitzpatrick, vice president of Manufacturers Bank of Southfield, stresses the importance of individual contact with creditors.

"We need to know what type of individual they are; what their needs are; what their income is; and what the future holds for them," Fitzpatrick said. He added that individual arrangements are almost always in order, whether it be refinancing to lower payments, or remortgaging.

While so many people are facing money management problems, very few are able to admit it. Fitzpatrick claims that the major roadblock is embarrassment.

"People just don't know how to express their difficulties to loan officers.

We're people too. We know what they're going through," he said.

ALTHOUGH singular contact is a must with creditors, Lee J. Miller of Oakland County Cooperative Extension Service in Michigan State University, feels a great amount of hassle can be avoided by watching credit shopping after the paychecks have stopped coming in.

Miller feels that the use of buy-now, pay-later techniques for the unemployed are fine if absolutely necessary. However, credit shopping, he said, "can make you forget that there's no money for the item itself."

At Fitzpatrick, Miller stresses the importance of looking at each person's particular needs.

"By calling our office we can set up a budget analysis, which is a very helpful thing to have when an income has shifted to a different level," Miller said.

## Museum shows rare glass

A special exhibit of rare holly amber and Custard glass is now on display in Plymouth Historical Museum, 155 S. Main Street.

Holly amber, also known as golden agate, was made only from January until June 1903. The pressed-glass pattern features holly leaves in amber-shaded glass.

Custard glass is opaque, sometimes

known as butterilk glass and was first made in 1886. It reached its popularity peak in the 1920s.

The museum is open Thursday, Saturday and Sunday from 1-4 p.m. Admission is \$1 for adults; 50 cents for those from 12-17; and 25 cents for children. Special educational tours may be arranged in advance by calling the museum, 455-8940.



