### CONTINUING SHOWS

**Detroit Gallery of Contemporary Crafts** — The gallery will have glass by Powers, Gilmer and Kelman, ceramics by Norm Schulman and Judy Kogod and woven garments by Marlene Appel through July. These special things are shown in conjunction with a pleasant changing selection of fine crafts and a luncheon menu of excellent food. Hours are 11 a.m. to 5 p.m. Mondays-Saturdays, Fisher Building, Detroit.

**Gallery Renaissance** — The July-August show focuses on about 16 plus work by three Mexican artists and a selection of Japanese wood block prints. Some of the local people in the group show are Bertha Cohen, Phyllis Ithman, Sylvia Viglietti, Edil Weddige and Vera Wolfe. The gallery is at 400 Renaissance Center, Level 2.

**Galerie de Boicourt** — "Country Americana in Review/History Through Antiques" with guest curator Mary Roberts of Birmingham, will be at the gallery through July. The exhibit and sale features furniture and accessories, quilts, pottery and baskets. Folk paintings by Sheila Burns, folk sculpture by Julius Skroderius, and gravestone rubbings by Dr. George Burns. All three artists are from Michigan. A rare book, "The White House Gallery of Official Portraits of the Presidents," published in 1901 is also on display. **Iagolatsky LTD** — Display of rare antique elephants will be in the gallery through July. The exhibit, considered to be the world's largest, once belonged to Roy Gamble of Tacoma, Wash. Included are Chinese, Japanese, Indian, 17th

and 18th century pieces ranging in price from under \$100 to \$30,000. Hours are 10 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. Mondays-Fridays, 251 Merrill.

**Detroit Focus Gallery** — Special exhibition, "Focus Extended." The show features 12 local artists and runs through Aug. 2, noon to 5 p.m. Wednesday-Saturday, 1010 Beaubien, Detroit.

**Cantor/Lemberg Gallery** — Paintings, drawings and constructions by William Antonow will be at the gallery through Aug. 2. A former Detroit, Antonow now lives in New York but keeps his ties with the area through regular shows. Gallery hours are 11 a.m. to 5:30 p.m. Tuesday-Saturday, 539 N. Woodward.

**Pontiac Art Center** — "Denier/Cri" (The Latest Thing) is a fusion of New Wave music and art. The art will be by students from the Center for Creative Studies. Show runs through July 26 at 47 Williams, Pontiac.

**Detroit Institute of Art** — "Kick Out the Jams" is an exhibition of work by Detroit's Cass Corridor artists. The Detroit Institute of Arts is at 5200 Woodward, Detroit.
