James Galway plays his flute at 8:30 p.m. Thursday with the Detroit Symphony Orchestra at Meadow Brook Music Festival.

Thursday's conductor is British-born Raymond Leppard who has made headlines in opera houses and concert halls around the globe. He will lead the Detroit Symphony Orchestra in a program of Rimsky-Korsakov, Bach, Mozart and Stravinsky.

Coal miner's daughter Loretta Lynn sings her sad country songs at 8:30 p.m. Friday. Johnny Russell opens the show.

Leppard returns to the podium at 8:30 p.m. Saturday to conduct the Detroit Symphony Orchestra with mezzo-soprano Claudine Carlson and tenor Frank Little singing. Music by Schubert and Mahler is featured.

Pianist-conductor John Covelli appears at 7:30 p.m. Sunday with the Detroit Symphony Pops.

THE GROUNDS are open 2½ hours before evening concerts for picnicking or dining at Trumbull Terrace.

All concerts are held in the Baldwin Pavilion on the Oakland University campus near Rochester, with entrances on Walton Boulevard and Adams Road. More than 7,000 people can sit in the pavilion and on the lawn.

"The Cure" is a silent Charlie Chaplin film of comparatively little note from the 1920s, but we list it here because it's about time we reminded you of the full program offered by the Redford Theatre.

Whenever the Redford schedules a film — two or three times a month — the film itself is only half the show. The other half is a sing-along pipe organ performance led by organist Bob Richards.
