

Decathlon beckons area athlete

Jack Johansson knows first-hand what Bruce Jenner experienced in winning the decathlon at the Montreal Olympics four summers ago.

The budding Troy High School track star has already won two decathlons, and is aiming for the national title. Johansson was the state All-American Livonia Bentley High School in mid-June, and the regional at Hammond, Ind. June 21-22.

The decathlon takes two days to complete. The first five events are the 100-meter run, long jump, shot put, high jump and the 400-meter (quarter-mile) dash. The second day's concluding five events are the 1200-meter high hurdles, discus, pole vault, javelin and 1,500 meters (mile) run.

"I normally run two miles and practice throwing the discus in the morning, and in the afternoon I work on the javelin," said the 6-foot-1, 140-pound Johansson. "I try to run two more miles at night, and I try to get to the (high school) track when I can during the day."

One drawback to speed skating on roller skates is the expensive equipment. A good pair of competition skates costs about \$300. Also needed: at least three sets of wheel bearings (\$32 a set), three or four different types of wheels (\$75 a set for the best), and the team shorts and jersey (\$15).

"There are going to be a lot of good guys at the nationals," said Johansson. "If I run well I can finish among the top 10, and if I run excellent I may be among the top five. But I really don't know."

Johansson's high school coach is John Bancroft. He is training for the decathlon — a grueling sport that consists of 10 track and field events — with his brother Carl, who was an All-American Junior College runner.

"None of his scores are outstanding, but for one person to put it together the way he has is quite an accomplishment," said Bancroft. "The kid's resilient; there aren't too many like him."

Also on the team are Dooley's wife, Sue, and his young daughter, Angie, 31. Sue is the oldest team member. Angie is the youngest at 8.

"Over the years they've come up with better and lighter equipment," said Dooley, explaining the expense of the skates. "Speed skates used to be about 3 1/2 pounds. Now they're down to 2 1/2. All this experimenting with new materials and such is expensive, and the companies pass it on to the consumer."

"On the first day, the 400-meter dash (quarter-mile) is the most physically tiring event. It's the

second day when things start to take their toll — especially if it's sunny. At the end of the second day — in the 1,500 meters — you're gone. It's just who can hold on at the end."
