SO FINE THAT the Pillos decided to continue the tradition. This year they played host family to Annika Koistinen, 18, from Finland and Hakan Sjostrom, 19, from Sweden.
Sjostrom attended Cranbrook Institute and lived with the Pillos on weekends only. Annika spent a semester each at North Farmington and Harrison.

Both move about the house casually, doing assigned chores, answering the telephone, relaxing on summer break until they return to their real homes in a couple of weeks.
