

Well-traveled tennis pro wins Grand Slam crown

Experience conquered youth Sunday in the men's singles final of the Grand Slam Tennis Tournament at Livonia Family Y.

Ian Harris, 27, who has played tennis all over the world, downed lefty Mark Pinchoff, 6-3, 6-4, to claim the first place prize of \$300.

Pinchoff, who starred during his prep days at West Bloomfield High School, said, "I was hitting the ball all right, but didn't execute well enough to win."

"Key points were the difference," said the 19-year-old native of Bloomfield Hills. "He played them better than I did."

Harris, a teaching pro at Franklin Racquet Club this summer, used an oversized racquet effectively with his aggressive serve-and-volley style.

"This is our third meeting and I've won all three," said Harris, "and they've all been close."

"The conditions were slow here. I just wanted to get the ball back in play. That left-hand serve is tough. Mark's a helluva player and in a few years he'll be beating me."

Pinchoff, who played No. 5 singles

this spring for Trinity University (Tex.), could not accept the \$200 runnerup prize money because he is still an amateur.

"I thought I could have served and volleyed a little better," he said. "I rushed things a little bit."

HARRIS THRILLED the surprising turnout at Grand Slam with his pinpoint volleys and rocket serve.

He's played the past four months overseas, competing in the French Open and Wimbledon (England) qualifier. Harris spent three weeks playing in Nigeria.

Among his victims abroad this spring included top professional Ashraf Armatraj of India and NCAA finalist Bill Maze, the No. 14th ranked player in the world.

"I'm fortunate enough to get the free time off," said Harris, the tournament's No. 1 seed. "I came over here to Franklin two years ago from Kalamazoo with John Trump (head pro)."

"He's given me time to play and travel. I really appreciate that."

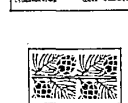
