Four injured at parade

Three youngsters passed out from heat exhaustion and a fourth suffered injuries in a fall from a float during the annual Founders Festival Parade in Farmington Saturday morning.

Mark Podsiadlik, 16, of Farmington, fell off an aquatic club float near the parade review stand at Grand River and Farmington roads. Witnesses said the accident occurred when a pickup truck pulling the float hit a bump in the road.

The youth suffered abrasions on the forehead, a chipped tooth and a cut arm. He was treated and released from

Botsford General Hospital.

A 12-YEAR-OLD girl slumped between two parked cars on Oakland was discovered by two Farmington Public Safety officers on patrol just before noon.

The girl, Tracy Granzin of Farmington, was overcome by the heat and was semi-conscious. She was treated with oxygen and cold packs.

A Novi medical team also assisted police in reviving the girl, who suffered from a rapid pulse and hot, dry skin. Temperatures reached 85 degrees Saturday.

John M. Mulroy, Republican, 21, of Southfield. Assistant to director of registration and scheduling at the University of Detroit, Mulroy graduated with honors from U of D with a bachelor's degree in education.

Joseph Schmidt, Republican, 62, of Southfield. Schmidt is owner/operator of an insurance agency and a graduate of Wayne State University. He has authored a book on personality development.

In the 24th County Commission District, candidates William Brinker, a Democrat, and Dennis Murphy, a Republican, are running unopposed.

That's also the case in the 27th County Commission District, where Democrat Joann Blythe Echlin will square off against John J. McDonald, a Republican, in November.

Tuesday's voters will also decide whether to renew one quarter mill for Oakland County parks. The purpose of the renewal is to continue development of recreational facilities in the park system, which includes eight parks and 2,700 acres of land.

Continued millage support will provide improved camping facilities at Addison Oaks, an environmental education center at Independence Oaks, recreation facilities at Waterford Oaks, expanded

day use at all parks, more senior citizen activities and more recreation facilities.

Car hits pole, driver killed

Police are investigating a July 17 auto accident which took the life of a 20-year-old Farmington man.

Ronald J. King became the first traffic fatality of the year in Farmington after the car he was driving on east-bound Shiloh Road hit another vehicle at Power Road and struck a utility pole.

King, suffering massive head injuries, was taken to Botsford General

The accident occurred at 2:37 a.m. King died two days later at Botsford.
