Lakes offer bountiful fishing

You don't have to go all the way to the Upper Peninsula to find a fine fishing spot.

Independence Oaks County Park, near Clarkston, boasts a 68-acre, spring-fed Crooked Lake. The lake abounds with pike, bass and bluegill. Pumpkinseed, sunfish and bullhead can also be caught there.

Boats are available for rent, or fishermen can cast from any of the piers along the shoreline.

Crooked Lake is restricted to non-gasoline powered boats only.

ADDITIONAL LAKES. In Addition Oaks near Oxford and Groveland Oaks near Holly, are also open to

fishermen. Both parks also have boats for rent.

Admission to all these Oakland County Parks is \$2 for residents, \$3 for non-residents. A vehicle entry permit is \$7 for residents, \$10 for non-residents. Senior citizens may enter any park on weekdays at no charge.

A fishing for fun contest will be held Aug. 20 at Groveland Oaks. Teams of two anglers each — an adult and related child — will compete for prizes ranging from the largest fish caught to the youngest angler. There is a registration fee of \$5 per team.
