Gets congressional listen

If sincerity and determination were all that it takes, America would already be singling a new national anthem called 'Ob Beau-tiul America penned by Angeline Rivers of Southfield.

"I'll raise the root of the Capitol," predicts Mrs. Rivera, the 67-year-old mother of six children who once trained as an opera sing- en and still has her pipes. When she practices her anthem at home with her daughter Carmen on harmony the neighborhood knows it.

'I know Congress is going to pass this once they hear me,' she says. 'I haven't got a date set because they're all out for summer recess.'

Says. In a consequence of the two stanzas and chorus read into the Congressional Record of May 30 by U.S. Rep. William Brodhead, Democrat representing the 17th District.

"I know of Ms. Rivera's dedication to the United States and her strong feeling that our country should be glorified in song," Brodhead told the Congress.

J don't want to push anybody over. "This could be the hird national anthem. I'm not trying to make mine on top, but maybe in the top three."

"Mrs. Rivera isn't even overly critical of the words to "America the Beautiful," on which tune her anthem is based. "There's nothing wrong with those lytics," she said. "But they expired in 1926. They need some new ones. Of course, nobody asked for them, but now they got them."

IF THE ANTHEM doesn't catch on, which she doubts, it will still have been worth the effort, she says, "for my own soul, for the coming generations to know how I feel."
