The Women's Professional Bowlers Association (WPBA) tournament is coming to Rochester afterail. Tourney directors are finalizing plans for the Stroh Light Detroit Clas-sic that will run from Aug. 24-28 at Bill Srock's North Hill Lanes in Rochester. According to Ron Hingst, who is handling public relations, the \$25,000 affair will attract some of the country's premier women bowlers.

"We expect to have all of the top women bowlers here, including Donna Adamek who was the pro bowler of the year for the past two years on the women's tour," said Hingst, who is or-ganizing a press conference this Tues-

WPBA officials in Chicago said the Rochester stop will be the seventh WPBA tournament of the season.

When the WPPA bypassed Rochester early in the year it appeared that the tournament was off. However, the women pros have always liked the well-oiled North Hill Lanes and wanted to keep Bill Srock's popular bowling house on the WPBA tour.

The women pros have annually rolled high games at North Hill Lanes. Last year the 24 match-play qualifiers averaged 216 through 24 games, including a high of 235.3 by tournament winner Pam Buckner.

"We like the house (North Hill Lanes), and Detroit is one of the best markets for bowling in the country," said Roger Blaemire — the WPBA's executive director — just prior to last year's tournament.

IN 1978 and 1979 North Hill Lanes

hosted professional bowling tourna-ments early in the year near the begin-ning of the WPBA season. In 1978 it was the National Bank-Bonanza Bowl-ing Classic, and last winter the tourna-ment was shortened to the Bonanza

Buckner rolled a strike-filled 277 to beat reck-headed Californian Betty Mor-ris in last years' finals. Morris had fin-ished fourth after match play, and de-feated Adamek, Nikki Giannilas and Toni Gillard to reach the finals. Gillard, soft-spoken southpaw from Ohio, has been a standout bowler at Morth Hill Lanes in the past two tour-naments.
