

# Area to host women's bowling tourney

WPBA officials in Chicago said the Rochester stop will be the seventh WPBA tournament of the season.

When the WPBA bypassed Rochester early in the year it appeared that the tournament was off. However, the women pros have always liked the well-oiled North Hill Lanes and wanted to keep Bill Srock's popular bowling house on the WPBA tour.

The women pros have annually rolled high games at North Hill Lanes. Last year the 24 match-play qualifiers averaged 216 through 24 games, including a high of 235.3 by tournament winner Pam Buckner.

"We like the house (North Hill Lanes), and Detroit is one of the best markets for bowling in the country," said Roger Blaenire — the WPBA's executive director — just prior to last year's tournament.

IN 1978 and 1979 North Hill Lanes

hosted professional bowling tournaments early in the year near the beginning of the WPBA season. In 1978 it was the National Bank-Bonanza Bowling Classic, and last winter the tournament was shortened to the Bonanza Classic.

More than 100 pros from across the

country participated in last year's \$50,000 Classic, which contained one of the most lucrative professional bowling packages ever offered.

Buckner has been unbeatable in Rochester. Two years ago she earned \$4,000 and last year netted \$6,000 as the tourney's winner.

In addition, Buckner could have landed an extra \$100,000 last year by throwing six consecutive strikes immediately after winning the tournament (she missed on the first attempt). The bonus was offered by CBS television which videotaped the step-ladder finals.

Buckner rolled a strike-filled 277 to beat red-headed Californian Betty Morris in last year's finals. Morris had finished fourth after match play, and defeated Adamk, Nikki Giannilas and Toni Gillard to reach the finals.

Gillard, a soft-spoken southpaw from Ohio, has been a standout bowler at North Hill Lanes in the past two tournaments. Gillard, who rolled a 300 two years ago, has finished second and third in Rochester.

Virginia Norton, Patty Costello, Judy Soutar, Pat Conston, Cheryl Robinson and Vesma Grinfeltes are other leading WPBA players.

The Pro-Am portion of the Stroh Light Detroit Classic will begin Aug. 24, and the WPBA portion of the tourney will begin Aug. 25.

One of the oddities the ever-growing popularity of bowling is the fact that the least costly item in the renovation of the establishments proved to be the greatest lure for the newcomers.

To be sure the automatic pinsetter

saved the game, but it was the innovation of painting arrows on several boards on each side of the lanes that were approved by those who were just learning and even those who were

"spot" bowlers. The arrows are designated to guide the bowler in the release of the ball. In the older days bowlers spoke of such things as the "outside" board, or any

one of the boards, counting from right to left for the right hand bowlers. Many of them adopted board 6 as the spot that gave them the best results.

With the newcomers it was difficult

enough to release the ball properly at the foul line without taking the trouble to count the boards. Then some one, identity unknown, came up with the idea to paint black arrows on the boards.

And the cost of painting the arrows or having them as insets in the boards, is no more costly than the score sheets used in the telescope.

THE WOMEN PRO bowlers are going to try it again. After the rumpus last year at Bill Srock's North Hill Lanes, they'll be back.

Most of the top women pros in the land will descend on the Rochester establishment to open the tournament on August 24.

The City Council of the City of Farmington Hills held a regular meeting July 28, 1980. Mayor Soronen opened the meeting at 7:30 o'clock. Members present were: Burwell, Laago, Oppenhouse, Soronen, Wolf and Alkaeb. Others present were City Manager Savage, City Clerk Cairns and City Attorney Poehlman.

Council approved the minutes of May 29, special and July 14, regular, 1980.

Resolution approving Project Plan for the Economic Development Corporation of the City of Farmington Hills, Hunters Square Project, including issuance of Limited Obligation Revenue Bonds of approximately \$5,000,000, was adopted.
