Loneliness is one of life's inescapable burdens. It is one of the fundamental realities of human existence.

When we are gripped by a sense of loneliness, we sometimes feet that we are unique in experiencing this sensation. But the truth is that to be human is to encounter, from time to time, the unsettling and disquicting feeling of a dark and dreary loneliness.

SOME TIME ago I read of a service in New York City called "Care-Ring" to deal with one aspect of the loneliness and contemporary urban life. For \$17.50 a month, each subscriber to Care-Ring receives two telephone calls a day from one of the service's telephone

"The subscribers," reports the New Yorker, "usually, choose the morning and evening hours for their calls, but they are permitted to select any two times around the clock."

If anything is suspected to be wrong, Care-Ring notlifes the subscriber's doctor and sends one of their registered



urses to the scene. Care-Ring is being ranchised in other cities around the

franchised in other cities around the country.

Loneliness seems to be on the upswing in our affluent, technological and mobile society. San Francisco, one of the most beautiful and cosmopolitan of American cities, has the highest rate of suicides.

suicides.

Yet loneliness is part of what it means to be human. It will remain, no matter how we develop or regress.

DAG HAMMERSKJOLD once re-ected on this theme in his book,

"Markings." He wrote: "What I ask for is absurd; that life shall have a meaning. What I strive for is the impossible; that my life shall acquire a meaning. I dare not believe, I do not see how I shall ever be able to believe: that I am not alone.

"What makes loneliness an anguish is not that I have no one to share my bur-den, but this: I have only my own bur-den to bear."

How do we handle loneliness? The behavioral sciences, and psychiatry in particular, have given man a better un-

derstanding of alienation from himself, and from his fellow man. We are in-debted to Sigmund Freud for his help in understanding our loneliness.

I am likewise impressed by Care-Ring and every organization and human service that will reduce our sense of isolation and the feeling that no one really cares about us.

Care-Ring may be the reminder I need to make a personal visit or a phone call to someone who needs my reassurance. But I am convinced that in the long run the greatest help I can offer is to encourage people to search for the values of life as did Dag Hammerskjold.

AN AMERICAN author once pointed AN AMERICAN author once pointed out "All religion, all life, all expression comes down to this: the effort of the human soul to break through its barrier of loneliness, and make some contact with another seeking soul, or with what all souls seek, which is (by any name) Cod."
