

Bloomfield Legion earns district crown

Bloomfield Legion's baseball team advanced to the North Central Regional Connie Mack Championships by winning the eight-team double-elimination Pontiac District Connie Mack Tournament.

Bloomfield did it the hard way. The local team dropped its tournament opener to the Detroit Eagles, then battled back through the losers' bracket, winning five straight games. Bloomfield capped off its championship drive with a 3-1 victory over Clarkson Transjig on Monday.

The Legion team got off to its customary fast start in the final, scoring all three runs in the first inning. Eric Girdler singled with one out to get it started. Girdler scored on a double by Paul Dreiman.

man. Dave Mitchell then singled to score Dreiman. Bruce Morrison followed with a single, and Mitchell scored all the way from first base on a hit-and-run play.

GIRDLER STARTED and went the first six innings. He allowed four hits, walked two and struck out three.

Mitchell relieved in the seventh after Girdler walked the first batter. He got two batters to pop out and the third to ground out to end the inning.

Mitchell was Bloomfield's leading batter with two triples and a single in three at bats. Bloomfield got into the final by beating the Detroit Eagles, 2-1, earlier that day. Paul Sabol went

all the way on the mound for the winners. He scattered seven hits while striking out three. Sabol did not walk a batter.

Bloomfield got on the board first with a run in the second. Mitchell led off with a double, then moved to third base on a sacrifice bunt by Morrison. Bill Ebert brought him home with a sacrifice fly to right field.

The Eagles tied the game in the fourth, but Legion got the winning run in the sixth. Girdler led off with a single. Dreiman then attempted to bunt him over to second. The Eagles pitcher fielded the bunt and threw wild to first trying to nail Dreiman. Girdler was able to score on the throw, all the way from first. Dreiman was thrown out at the plate attempting to score on the same play.

Sabol paced Bloomfield's five-hit attack with two hits in two at-bats.

JOHN SILLICK turned his second win and best performance of the tournament on Sunday when he pitched a no-hitter against Transjig. Bloomfield won the game, 8-0. Transjig was undefeated coming into the game.

Sillick struck out four and walked one. He faced 16 batters in a game shortened by the eight-run mercy rule.

Bloomfield scored in every inning and pounded out seven hits total.

BLOOMFIELD LEGION 9, CRANBROOK 6

Bloomfield advanced to the final four teams in the Pontiac Connie Mack Tournament on Friday by defeating Cranbrook 9-6.

Mike Rom started for Legion and got the win. He worked 4 1/2 innings, giving up three runs on six hits. Rom walked two and struck out one.

Bill Ebert came on in the fifth inning with the bases loaded and two out. Ebert struck out his man and got the save. He worked the final two and one-third innings.

Bloomfield scored in bunches. The Legion team scored three in the first, three in the fourth and three in the sixth.

Bloomfield got its winning runs in the sixth after two outs. Bruce Morrison started the rally with a single. Rom doubled to put runners at second and third. Rick Hawkins singled and both runners scored. Hawkins scored on a triple by Eric Girdler.

Rom led Bloomfield at the plate with two hits — a double and a triple — in two at bats. He drove in one run.

Girdler drove in two runs with a double and a triple. Hawkins was 1-for-3 with three RBIs.

Not bad for a team that lost its first game Wednesday, then struggled through the losers' bracket to reach the semi-finals Sunday.

Macomb Woods, a team consisting mainly of players from Class A high school champion Grosse Pointe North, knocked Southfield out of the tournament on Sunday by handing the local team a 4-1 loss.

Macomb Woods, a player Southfield manager Pat Sullivan picked up for the tournament from Milford, started and took the loss. Domke pitched two innings and allowed three runs on two hits and three walks. A two-run Macomb homer was Domke's downfall. He struck out two.

Jeff Setteceri relieved and went the rest of the way. He allowed one run on one hit. Setteceri struck out seven.

Southfield managed five hits, two more than Macomb, but failed to take advantage of its opportunities.

Southfield put itself in the position of being knocked out of the tournament by losing on Wednesday to Saginaw Means, 5-0. Mike Tetreault, a player Southfield picked up from Farmington

for the tournament, started and worked 6 1/2 innings. Tetreault struck out four, walked three and allowed seven hits. Relief pitcher Andy Antonucci retired the two batters he faced in the seventh.

Singles by Ken Sullivan and Ron Curcio were the only offense Southfield was able to muster.

Southfield came back Wednesday evening and bombed Saginaw B & K Tool 12-4 in a game shortened by the mercy rule.

Tracy Totten started for Southfield, but was pulled after walking the first three batters he faced. Domke came on and went the rest of the way. Domke allowed two runs on four hits while striking out seven and walking six.

Dennis Sacco led Southfield with two hits. Southfield tallied eight hits for the game. B & K pitchers issued 10 free passes and Southfield made the most of them, leaving only one runner stranded on the basepaths.

Southfield nipped the Bridgeport Green Hornets 5-4 on Saturday to stay alive in the tournament.

Setteceri got the win. He went all the way for Southfield, striking out four, walking two and allowing five hits. Mitch McCann was 2-for-3.
