Atlantis tankers triumph

The Birmingham-Bloomfield Atlantis Swim Club finished second in the Michigan AAU Long Course Swimming Championships held Thursday through Sunday at the Southfield Civic Center.

The Atlantis team finished with 589 points, 250½ points behind first-place Dearborn Recreation's 839½ points.

The Oakland Live Yers were third with 505 points, and the Royal Oak Penguins were fourth with 360 points.

The Michigan Stingray Swim Association, based in Farmington Hills, placed eighth with 217 points.

The Southfield Swim Club and the West Bloomfield Swim Club also participated in the event, but did not finish in the top 10.

Atlantis was third in the boys' competition with 216 points, and was second in the girls' competition with 373 points.

THE BIRMINGHAM-BLOOMFIELD team won the 11-to-12-year-old age group with 178 points. Mark Shage-

na paced Atlantis with 57 points. Shage-na had first-place finishes in the 11-12 boys' 200-meter freestyle (2:17.77), 100-meter butterfly (1:10.37), 100-meter freestyle (1:03.34), 400-meter freestyle (4:51.41), and 50-meter freestyle (28.85).

Brian Brace tallied 54 points in the 11-12 boys' age group with wins in the 100-meter backstroke (1:13.64) and 50-meter backstroke (33.73).

The Atlantis team also took the 15-18 girls' age group with 212 points. Kara McGrath led the Birmingham-Bloomfield team with 68 points. McGrath won the 15-18 girls' 800-meter freestyle (9:09.52), 100-meter freestyle (1:01.56), 200-meter butterfly (2:28.35), 400-meter freestyle (4:31.63), 100-meter butterfly (1:36.65), 400-meter individual medley (5:15.61) and 200-meter individual medley (2:29.16).

Anita Rival of the Atlantis team finished fifth in the 15-18 girls' age group with 30 points.

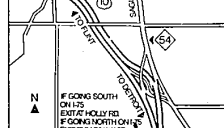
