thing but the paint job at no expense to the customer. THERE ARE similar warranties at other dealerships and independent used car lots but these vary. Some pay 50 percent of the cost, others pay 25 percent of the cost.

In the case of Bob Cooks', the models made between 1977-80 come with a full coverage warranty. After that, it varies.

A 10-year-old car is usually sold on an 'as is' basis. The buyer is responsible for all repairs once the car leaves the lot.

Under Michigan law, the car's breaks and lights must work. In other words, the buyer must be able to safely drive the car off the lot.

As with every other major purchase, buyers should examine the warranty, carefully.

"It's very rare there's a meaningful warranty," Ms. Shapiro said. "Most of the cars are sold as is."
